7. REPORT FOR DECISION – HAND OVER OF SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES TO PARISH COUNCILS

Recommendation

To decide if the Town Council wishes to apply for a free Speed Indicator Devices from Wiltshire Council.

Purpose of the Report

To decide if the Town Council wishes to apply for a free Speed Indicator Devices from Wiltshire Council.

Background

Wiltshire Council has written to all parishes advising that they are starting a process of handing over their Speed Indicator Devices (SIDS) to town and parish councils.

Wiltshire Council has 35 SIDS, however there are 253 town and parish councils in the county and 18 Community Area Boards therefore there will be roughly 2 SIDs per Area Board.

A policy has been set out which will make available free of charge to Town and Parish Council's on a first come first serve basis. However preference will be given in cases where at least 4 Town & Parish Councils are willing to collaborate in running a joint programme.

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Where a group of 4 or more town and parish councils jointly asking for a SID they will be immediately issued with up to 1no SID's, Officers have approached neighbouring parishes to see if we can set up a local consortium.

Other requests for SID's will be considered but will be held until overall demand levels are known. Individual town or parish councils will be limited to 1no SID. Once handed over the SIDs become the full responsibility of the town and parish councils.

Timeline

Issue of SIDs to groups of 4 or more – by end December 2015

Issue of SIDs to groups of 3 or less (assuming SIDs are available) – by end of March 2016

Distribution of any remaining SIDs – by end of April 2016

Funding considerations

The use of both the Area Board and CATG funding streams to pay for the running of any SID programme is not permitted. This is because the funding is in the form of Capital and cannot be used to run a service.

The use of both the Area Board and CATG funding streams to purchase new SIDs and associated equipment is permitted but would be subject to approval by the relevant Area Board and /or CATG.

Options Considered

The Committee needs to decide if it wishes to join with other parishes to acquire a free Speed Indicator Device from Wiltshire Council.

Implications and Risks

Financial and Resource Implications

Officers are unaware of any financial implication for the Council in the short term. At some point a new battery may be required to be purchased. There will be a small amount of staffing resource installing and dismantling the equipment.

Background

Mayenne at 2-3 Snuff Street, have applied to Wiltshire Council, the Licensing Authority, for a new premises licence.

The application is for

- Live Music – Monday to Sunday 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs. New Year's Eve 11:00hrs to 02:00hrs.
- Recorded Music – Monday to Sunday 09:00hrs to 01:00hrs. New Year's Eve 09:00hrs to 02:00hrs.
- Late Night Refreshment – Monday to Sunday 23:00hrs to 01:00hrs. New Year's Eve 23:00hrs to 02:00hrs
- Sale of Alcohol by retail ON and OFF the premises – Monday to Sunday 09:00hrs to 01:00hrs. New Year's Eve 09:00hrs to 02:00hrs.
- Hours open to the public – Monday to Sunday 09:00hrs to 01:00hrs. New Year's Eve 09:00hrs to 02:00hrs.

Currently the premises does not have a licence as it does not have any licensing activities.
