65. REPORT FOR DECISION – PARKING ON THE GREEN

Councillor Mrs Evans clarified the report and questions were asked regarding ownership of the land, the Town Clerk advised that the land was not registered separately from the Green.

Inspector Armstrong advised that his officers had moved motorists on and suggested that a low cost solution to stop vehicles access to the Green may prove beneficial. He also advised that funding maybe available from the Anti-Social Behaviour team at Wiltshire Council.

THAT officers instigate the purchase of planters to be placed on the Green in order to stop motor vehicles access onto the grass.
