645. REPORT FOR DECISION – 20mph SPEED RESTRICTION ASSESSMENT FOR DEVIZES EAST AND FUNDING REQUEST

After much debate, it was proposed by Councillor Evans, seconded by Councillor Mrs Burton and agreed

THAT Option 2 – Implement a 20mph speed limit within the estate (excluding Jump Farm Road). This will consist of repeater signage only. There will be additional soft engineering measures on Brickley Lane from its junction with Jump Farm Road to its junction with Nursted Close. This will help to remind drivers to lower their speed in this area. The committee also wanted included a reduction in the speed on Jump Farm Road back to 30mph, maximum funding would be £5,000.
