99. MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on the 8th June 2021 having been circulated to all Members were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

100. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Councillors Brown, Corbett, Ormerod and Stevens.

101. DISCLOSURES OF INTEREST

Councillors Nash and Wallis confirmed an interest in item 103, as members of Wiltshire Council's Eastern Area Regulatory Planning Committee.

Councillor Britten confirmed an interest in the first planning item to be discussed under item 103 (PL/2021/04601) as a friend of the applicant.

104. FOR INFORMATION – WILTSHIRE COUNCIL’S NOTICE OF PLANS GRANTED OR REFUSED

The committee received and noted the report.

105. FOR DECISION – METRO COUNTERS IN BRICKLEY LANE

After some discussion of the problem of speeding traffic in Brickley Lane, with representation made by a resident, it was proposed by Councillor Nash, seconded by Councillor Burton and AGREED UNANIMOUSLY

THAT the Committee supports the proposal to conduct a new ‘metro count’ in the Brickley Lane area, to better understand the effectiveness of the 20mph speed limit.

106. FOR DECISION – FORMALISATION OF NO CYCLING IN THE BRITTOX

Following a long discussion covering various cycling issues, it was proposed by Councillor Bridewell, seconded by Councillor Hopkins and AGREED UNANIMOUSLY

THAT the Committee supported the proposal to develop ‘No Cycling’ traffic orders for the Brittox via CATG, but that officers should first liaise with other cycling-interest groups to establish if there are any other such changes to be requested at the same time.

107. FOR DECISION – DOUBLE YELLOW LINES IN NORTHGATE GARDENS

Officers advised the Committee that Wiltshire Council had recently clarified that the area in question relates to a private drive and therefore falls outside the Council’s area of responsibility.

The Chairman confirmed that there was no need to discuss this matter further.

108. QUESTION TIME

Councillor Wallis notified the meeting that, although formal planning permission had not yet been granted by Wiltshire Council for event promotion signs on the Green, the Fulltone Festival organisers had received confirmation from Wiltshire Council that their signs could be displayed on the Green from July.

Officers confirmed that this would be added to the next Planning meeting agenda for discussion.
