10. REPORT FOR DECISION – GENERAL POWER OF COMPETENCE

Recommendation

That Devizes Town Council passes a resolution to continue its eligibility to exercise the General Power of Competence.

Purpose of the Report

To comply with the legislative requirements for Devizes Town Council to remain eligible to exercise the General Power of Competence.

Background

Town and Parish (Local) Councils are created by statute and, therefore, are only able to exercise those duties and powers conferred

on them by statute or necessarily implied or consequential to the exercise of a power.

There is a very wide range of powers that are contained within many different pieces of legislation stretching back to the 1800s.

The Localism Act 2011 provides for the General Power of Competence (GPC), giving eligible local councils the broad power to do anything that an individual generally may do. This removes the need to refer to individual pieces of statute to determine whether the Council can undertake an activity or not and gives much greater freedom to act.

In order to exercise the General Power of Competence, The Parish Councils (General Power of Competence) (Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012 requires eligible councils to pass a resolution confirming it has a:

- Minimum $\frac{2}{3}$ of the members holding office as a result of being declared elected
- “Qualified Clerk”

These two conditions have been achieved.

There are certain restrictions that give limitation in exercising the Act:

- Statutory duties must be considered such as the impact on crime and disorder and biodiversity.
- Procedural and financial duties e.g., delegation to individual councillors remains unlawful
- Other legislation must be complied with such as employment, equality, health & safety legislation.

Options Considered

The Council is asked to decide if it wishes to exercise the General Power of Competence and, if so, to pass the following resolution

THAT the Council confirms that it has achieved a minimum of two thirds of its membership holding office as a result of being declared elected and the Town Clerk holds the 2015 Cilca qualification and therefore elects to exercise the General Power of Competence.

Implications & Risks

Financial and Resource Implications

There are no financial or resource implications associated with this decision.

Legal Implications and Legislative Powers

The Localism Act 2011, Chapter 1, Part 1, sections 1-8 provides for the General Power of Competence (GPC).

Environmental Implications

There are no environmental implications associated with this decision.

Risk Assessment

There are no risks inherent with the decision to exercise the General Power of Competence – any risks are associated with the decisions that might be taken under these powers would need to be considered within the context of those decisions.

Crime and Disorder

There are no crime and disorder implications associated with this decision.


